Interview Component	Lastly, students will interview with an Arts Immersion faculty to discuss their essay in order to establish a specific arts-integrated curriculum track that is based on each student's interest and goals. Students will also schedule a meeting with their academic life coach to establish their academic plan. Students must attend these interviews accompanied by a parent or guardian.
